## **What stories of generosity**

In the run up to Advent St Elphin's had an amazing response to Operation Christmas Child (the Shoe Box appeal), with our congregation once again delivering a substantial number of gives for those significantly less fortunate than we are and this is a great example of the church family here at St Elphin's really making a difference to God's global mission, as we become his eyes, ears, hands and feet. Yet this wasn't enough, and we had the gracious opportunity to show God's love closer to home and what a local missional response there was for both Warrington Foodbank and the Y-Project homeless shelter.

Asking people to donate either food, toys, clothes, toiletries etc... into these boxes to be handed on to the Samaritans Purse, Warrington Foodbank and the Y-Project, and then given to children, families in need and the homeless to brighten their Christmas and provide them with what can be live changing items is something St Elphin's can be proud of and we each owe the organising team a very big note of thanks. I can say from my own view the results were utterly overwhelming.

This is just a few examples of the tremendous depth of generosity we have seen over the Christmas period, I personally know others who have donated birthday money to those in need, children who have donated a year's pocket money to the Y-Project and youth organisations that embraced our missional activities donated boxes and boxes of items. Our Christmas Giving Program for 2018 has been very successful as individuals, families, and organisations have come together to support our communities and those globally in hardship.

Some things to consider about our 2018 Christmas giving that might not be so obvious is it is used to help homeless young people, women and children escaping domestic violence, families in financial stress, and other vulnerable members of our community. The Christmas spirit is rooted in generosity. Not all families have the means to enjoy Christmas, but with the selflessness demonstrated by so many at St Elphin's during our Advent and Christmas season, we have been able to bring that little bit more joy into the lives of many families and individuals.

We have just celebrated Christmas, when we recalled together and proclaimed to all who would hear the angel's words to the shepherds in Luke 2:8. Good news of great joy is so sadly lacking in our world today and just as Jesus was not born to be king just for a day but to reign for all eternity. We are called to broadcast it continually as, when, and how we

can, both to encourage each other and to bless a needy world. Let us all engage in the GOOD NEWS this year, let's take a leaf from the angel's book as we tell of the joy born into the world and direct those who hear it to be like the shepherds, who found him, and saw and **BELIEVED**.

Wishing each and every one of you a wonderful 2019 and may the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be amongst us and remain with us this day and always. Amen

# The Times They Are A Changin'

For many in 1964 there were never truer words spoken than in the song 'The Times They Are A Changin' by Bob Dylan, but the same is equally as true today as they were when they were penned by Bob Dylan.

Many outside the Church of England look at an institution that they see as never changing and inflexible, where many on the inside of the Church feel that change is happening all the time and perhaps even with a view that 'they are a changin' too quickly.

But hopefully one area we might agree on whether we consider ourselves on the inside or outside of the church is that it is there or should be there for all the people of our communities.

Having listened to people in our Parish of Warrington, the young and the not so young who want to ensure that the church connects to them, be that in, modern language, rather than 16<sup>th</sup> Century Old English, or the types of worship music used. And it is in response to this feedback we developed the '**Together@4**' service which took place on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> November 2018 at 4pm in the Community Centre on St Katherines Way. This has launched a NEW modern worship service here at St. Elphin's, because here in the Parish of Warrington we are a growing church, built on God's transforming word, and who worship God with passion, intimacy and expectation.

We are all God's children, empowered by His Spirit, extending His Kingdom together, everywhere in every way. And following the very successful launch the **Together@4** service is now an additional Sunday service and the next few services are:

- Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> January 2019
- Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2019

And following the feedback from those attending the first **Together@4** service we are currently looking at this becoming a fortnightly service from Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> March 2019. This new contemporary service of worship will continue to take place at our community centre on St Katherines Way starting at 4.00pm and is

followed by food and time to get to know each other and become a community of God's mission here in Warrington.

**Together@4** is based on the believe that we serve the people in this place, especially those seeking answers, worship and prayer, and we communicate the goodness of Jesus with compassion and generosity. We look to make disciples, develop leaders, and contribute to the blessing of the whole Body of Christ.

All are welcome at **Together@4**, so why not put the date in your diary and why not bring your family and friends.

## **Parish Finances**

Do you struggle finding change on a Sunday morning? Do you know how much it costs to keep the church open?



The Parish Giving Scheme is a new, free way to help you plan your giving and where appropriate, do so tax efficiently. Whether you currently give by Standing Order, envelope or open plate you can easily make the switch to this secure and efficient Direct Debit system.

Used by the majority of dioceses, this is tried, tested and highly recommended for its reliability and ease of use, the Parish Giving Scheme can help you manage your giving in a stress-free way.

How does the Scheme work? You give your regular donations to your church by Direct Debit on a monthly, quarterly or annual basis on the 1st of the month.

Your full gift and any associated Gift Aid is automatically credited to your church the same month.

You can choose to inflation proof your gift which will make a huge difference to your church's finances.

You can change or cancel the amount at any time by a simple phone call, so you can confirm the amount that you give before your account is debited.

Warrington Parish Church has joined this scheme so if you are interested in joining either this scheme, our current Standing Order or Envelope Schemes please speak to Churchwardens Arnold Wright or Kathryn Hayes or Treasurer Wendy Bailey.

## Pause for Thought...with Norma Fox

*Though he may stumble, he will not fall, for the Lord upholds him with his hand*  
*Psalm 37 v24*

# The Knife Angel

You may have seen in the news that The Knife Angel is at the Cathedral until 31<sup>st</sup> January 2019.

The sculpture is 27ft high, and was created by artist Alfie Bradley as a memorial to those whose lives have been affected by knife crime. The Knife Angel was created at the British Ironworks Centre from 100,000 knives which were surrendered and collected during nationwide amnesties by 43 police forces in 2015/2016.




